- Annique Bennett, Parks staff, gave further clarification on the suspended Arts & Culture Grants program. She assured the group that the County is in agreement on the importance of the grants program, however complicated code and system changes are needed to bring that program into compliance.
- We heard insight on how the City of Edmonds and Everett structure and fund their arts programs. Both of these cities have funding sources beyond the 1% for the arts, which allows them to be more flexible than the County.

Because the County cannot grant funding this year, Kari Johnson, Vice-Chair of the Arts Commission, compiled a list of other funding sources for non-profits, independent artists, and municipalities.
